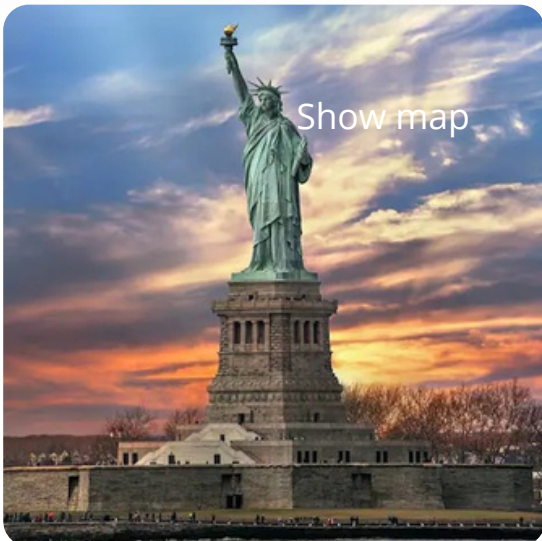
## Sightseeing

## Central Park

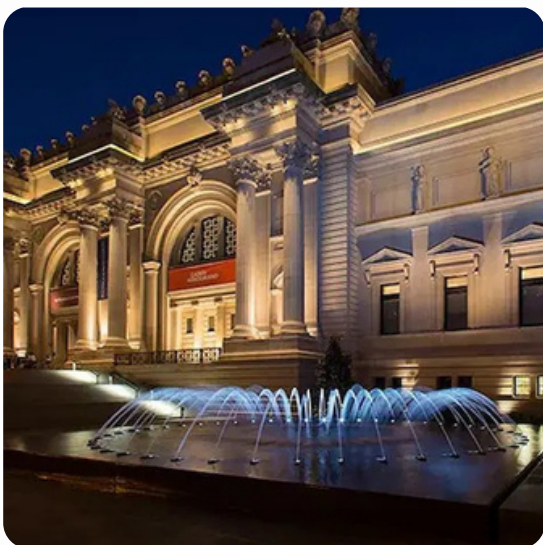

Take in 360-degree views of NYC from this iconic skyscraper's observatory decks, especially beautiful during sunset or at night.

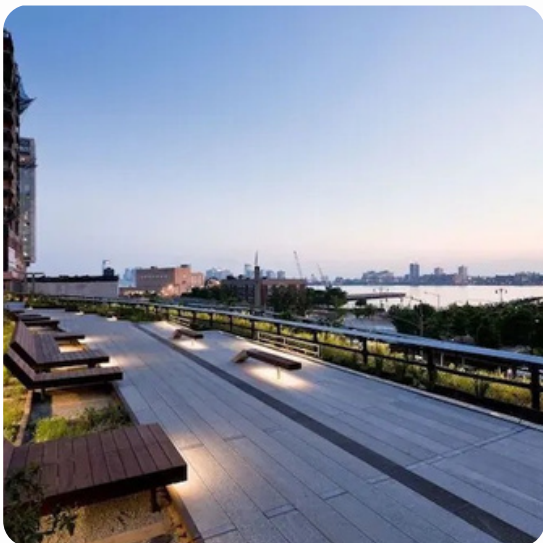


## One World Observatory

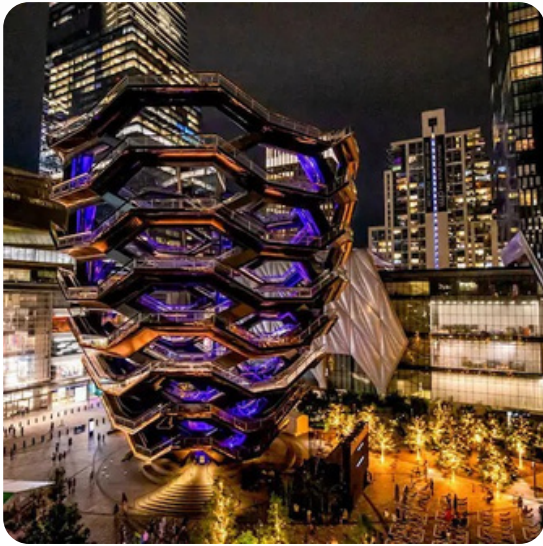
In Midtown, visit the Top of the Rock for views of Central Park and the Empire State Building, especially spectacular during the holiday season.

This solemn memorial honors the lives lost on September 11, 2001, with reflecting pools and a museum exploring the events and impact of that day.

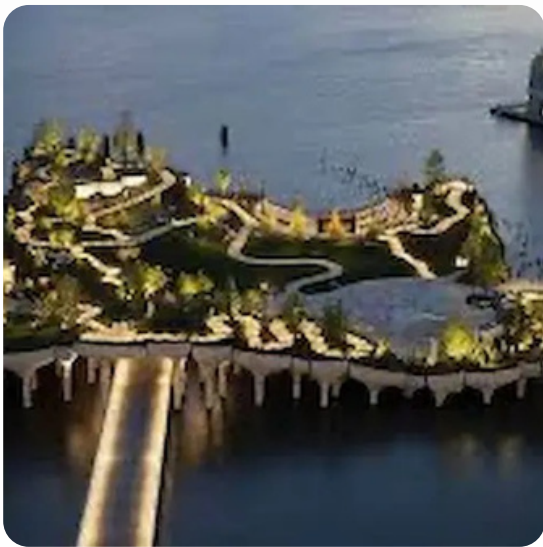


## Vessel

## **RiseNY**

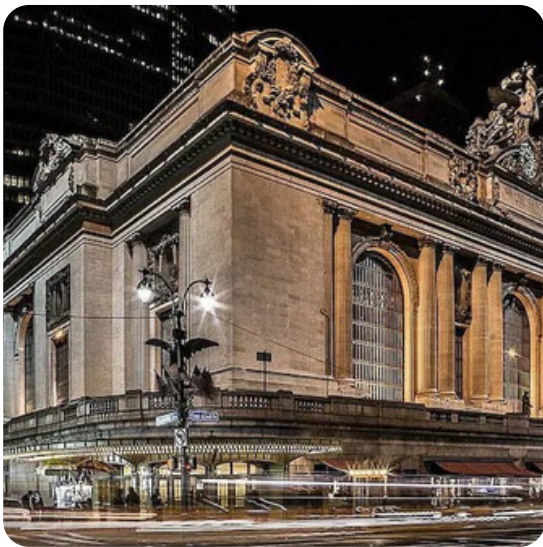
An immersive experience that includes a thrilling ride soaring over iconic NYC landmarks, with exhibits showcasing the city's vibrant culture.
